On the course we did have some damage out of the gate to our greens due to the extended thaw and ice on our tarps. We installed a new larger pump allowing us to water more holes at the same time. We purchased a fairway aerator and plan to seed after aeration to continue to improve our fairways.

We closed the driving range on September 15th to do long needed maintenance. Scraped the tee box down 10" where we found large boulders, steel, and slag and have done some irrigation repairs. We are also levelling the range for better drainage. We plan to have the range open in June 2025.
